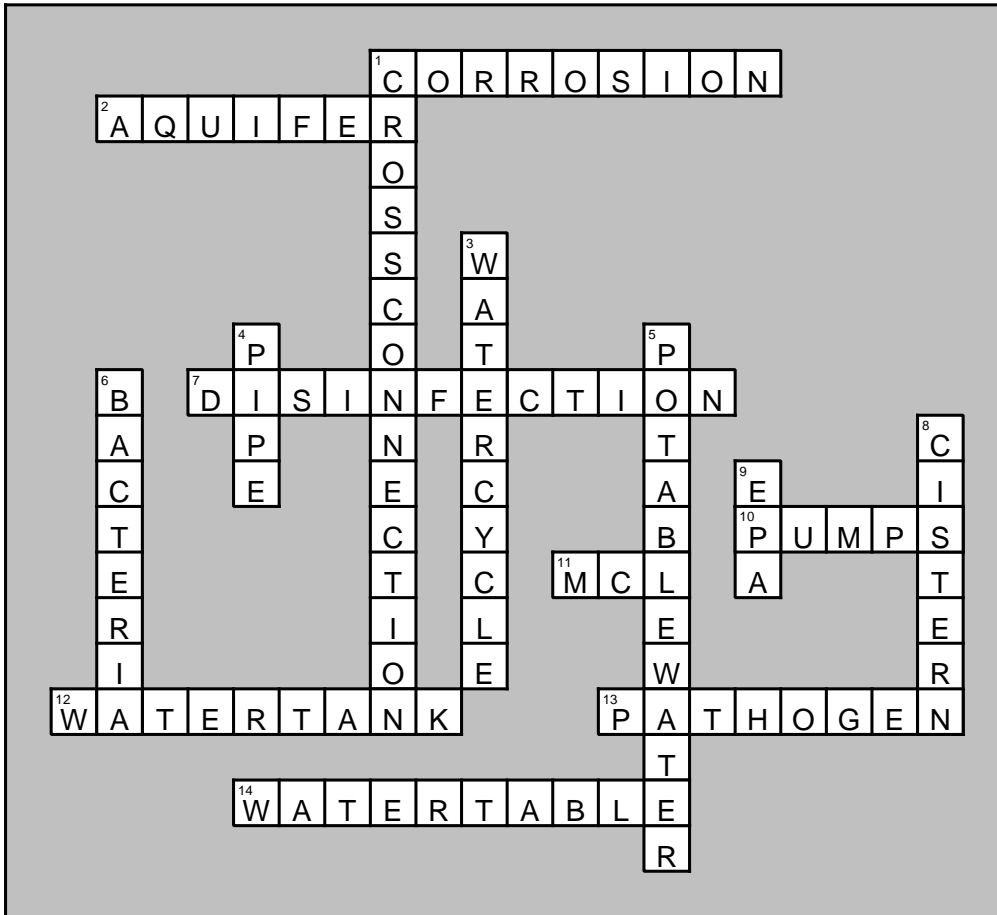

- The gradual decomposition or destruction of a material by chemical action.
- An underground layer of water-bearing permeable rock or unconsolidated materials (gravel, sand, silt, or clay) from which groundwater can be usefully extracted using a water well.
- The process designed to kill or inactivate most microorganisms in water, including essentially all disease-causing bacteria.
- Mechanical devices that are designed to transfer a non-solid material (liquid, gas, or powder) from one location to another.
- The abbreviation for the Maximum Contaminant Level. The largest allowable amount.
- A storage facility used to hold water until it is needed in the distribution system.
- A disease-causing organism.
- The upper surface of the zone of saturation of groundwater in an unconfined aquifer.

- A connection between a drinking water system and an unapproved water supply.
- The process of evaporation of water into the air and its return to earth by precipitation (rain or snow).
- This carries the water from the pumps and water tanks to houses and businesses.
- Water that does not contain objectionable pollution, contamination, minerals, or infective agents and is considered satisfactory for drinking.
- Living organisms, microscopic in size which usually consist of a single cell.
- A small tank or storage facility used to store water for a home or farm. Often used to store rainwater.
- A regulatory agency established by the U.S. Congress to administer the nation's environmental laws.
